We're All In This Together!

Stay Well:

- Wash your hands regularly (for at least 20 seconds each time).
- Watch your distance (maintain physical distance of six feet).
- Wear your mask.
- Stay home if you are sick.

Daily Health Check:

- Families should check their students and other family members before coming to schools.
- Employees will also be check themselves and their families prior to coming to work.
- If there is any concern that you or someone in your immediate household is sick or exhibiting possible COVID symptoms, stay home.

Responsible Reporting:

- If you, or someone in your immediate family, has tested positive for COVID-19, is awaiting a COVID-19 test result, or has had direct contact with a positive case of COVID-19, **please report it.**
- Employees should report a positive result to their building's COVID-19 Supervisor immediately.
- Families and students should report a positive result to the school nurse or school administrator immediately.

Face Coverings (Masks)

Masks are required on all campuses and buses

The CDC describes a cloth face covering as:

- Fabric covering over mouth and nose.
- Fit snugly, but comfortably and against the side of the face.
- Be secured with ties or ear loops.
- Include multiple layers of fabric.
- Allow for breathing without restriction.
- Be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape.



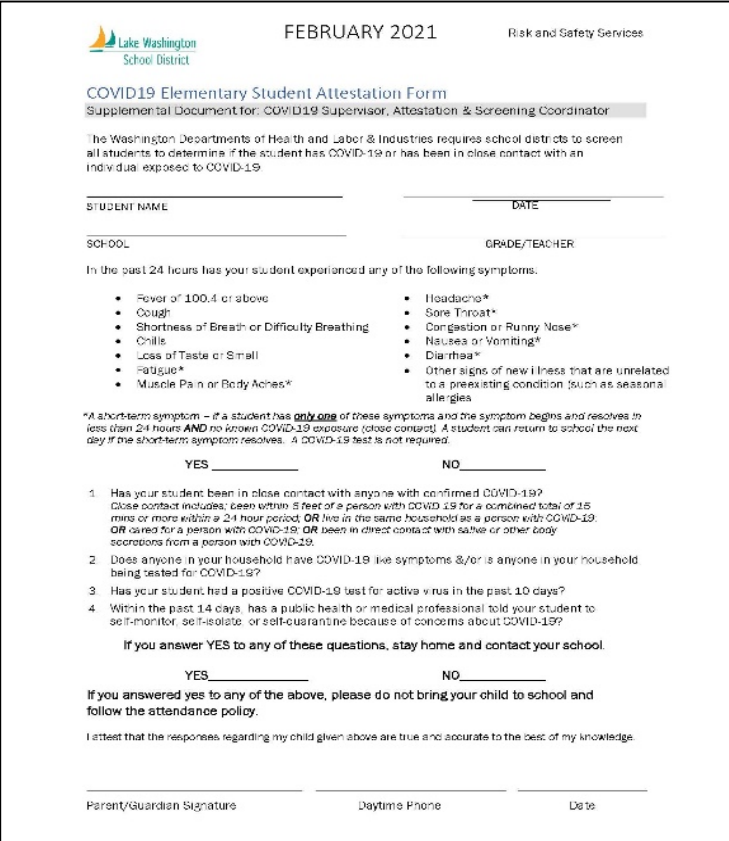
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Health Screening/Attestation

All students entering a school must have a Daily Student Attestation form submitted.

Students and staff must complete a health check each morning to attest they have no symptoms of COVID-19 or contacts with people who have tested positive for COVID-19.

The form is titled "COVID19 Elementary Student Attestation Form" and is dated "FEBRUARY 2021". It is a supplemental document for the COVID19 Supervisor, Attestation & Screening Coordinator. The form includes fields for Student Name, Date, School, and Grade/Teacher. It asks if the student has experienced any of the following symptoms in the past 24 hours: Fever of 100.4 or above, Cough, Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing, Chills, Loss of Taste or Smell, Fatigue, Muscle Pain or Body Aches, Headache, Sore Throat, Congestion or Runny Nose, Nausea or Vomiting, Diarrhea, and Other signs of new illness that are unrelated to a preexisting condition (such as seasonal allergies). It also includes four questions about close contact with someone with COVID-19, household symptoms, and testing. The form concludes with a statement of attestation and fields for Parent/Guardian Signature, Daytime Phone, and Date.

COVID19 Elementary Student Attestation Form
Supplemental Document for: COVID19 Supervisor, Attestation & Screening Coordinator

The Washington Departments of Health and Labor & Industries requires school districts to screen all students to determine if the student has COVID-19 or has been in close contact with an individual exposed to COVID-19.

In the past 24 hours has your student experienced any of the following symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4 or above
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing
- Chills
- Loss of Taste or Smell
- Fatigue*
- Muscle Pain or Body Aches*
- Headache*
- Sore Throat*
- Congestion or Runny Nose*
- Nausea or Vomiting*
- Diarrhea*
- Other signs of new illness that are unrelated to a preexisting condition (such as seasonal allergies)

*A short-term symptom – if a student has only one of these symptoms and the symptom begins and resolves in less than 24 hours **AND** no known COVID-19 exposure (close contact). A student can return to school the next day if the short-term symptom resolves. A COVID-19 test is not required.

1. Has your student been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?
Close contact includes: been within 5 feet of a person with COVID-19 for a combined total of 15 mins or more within a 24-hour period; **OR** live in the same household as a person with COVID-19; **OR** cared for a person with COVID-19; **OR** been in direct contact with saliva or other body secretions from a person with COVID-19.

2. Does anyone in your household have COVID-19 like symptoms &/or is anyone in your household being tested for COVID-19?

3. Has your student had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?

4. Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told your student to self-monitor, self-isolate, or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19?

If you answer YES to any of these questions, stay home and contact your school.

Physical Distancing

All schools in Lake Washington School District are working hard to create safe physical spaces for students and staff. The specifics of physical distancing will look different from school-to-school. Here are some items to note:

- Desks will be set up to facilitate 6-feet of physical distance.
- Masks are required – even at recess.
- Snacks will not be eaten in the classroom.
- Free meals will be available for all students to take home (grab-and-go).
- Bathroom capacity will be limited.
- Students and staff will be required to wash or sanitize hands upon entering the building and will be asked to wash and/or sanitize their hands frequently throughout the day.
- Visitors are limited. Parents/guardians will not be allowed on campus during in-person learning.
- Drop-off of items will be limited to critical items only – such as medication.



Symptoms of COVID-19 – When to keep your student home

The most common symptoms per Centers for Disease Control include:

- fever of 100.4 or above
- cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- chills
- fatigue
- muscle pain or body aches
- headache
- lost sense of taste or smell
- sore throat
- congestion or runny nose
- nausea or vomiting
- diarrhea, and/or
- other signs of new illness that are unrelated to a documented preexisting condition.

If you are sick, please stay home.

If you are out of work or school and test positive for COVID-19, please notify the school right away.
